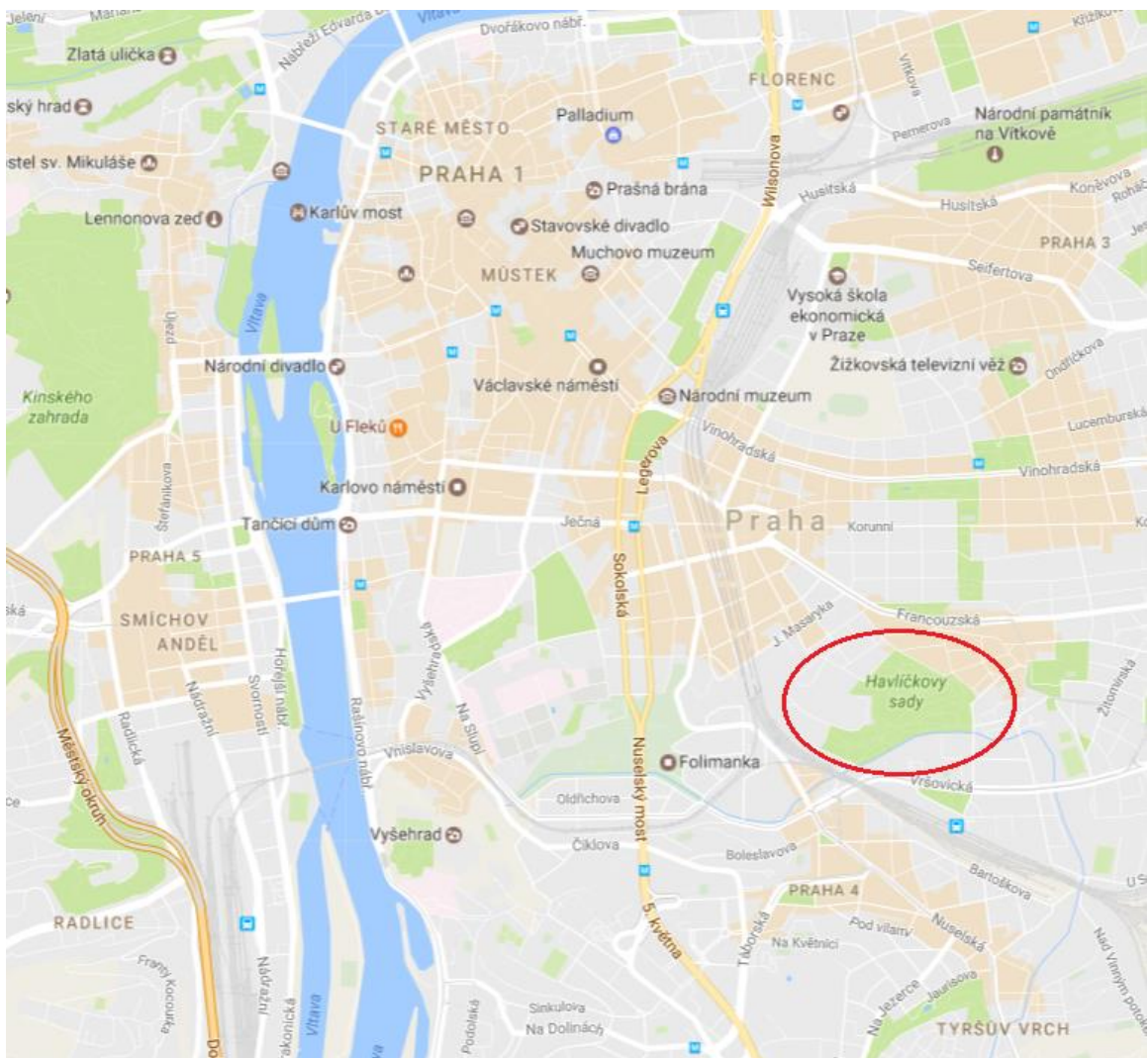
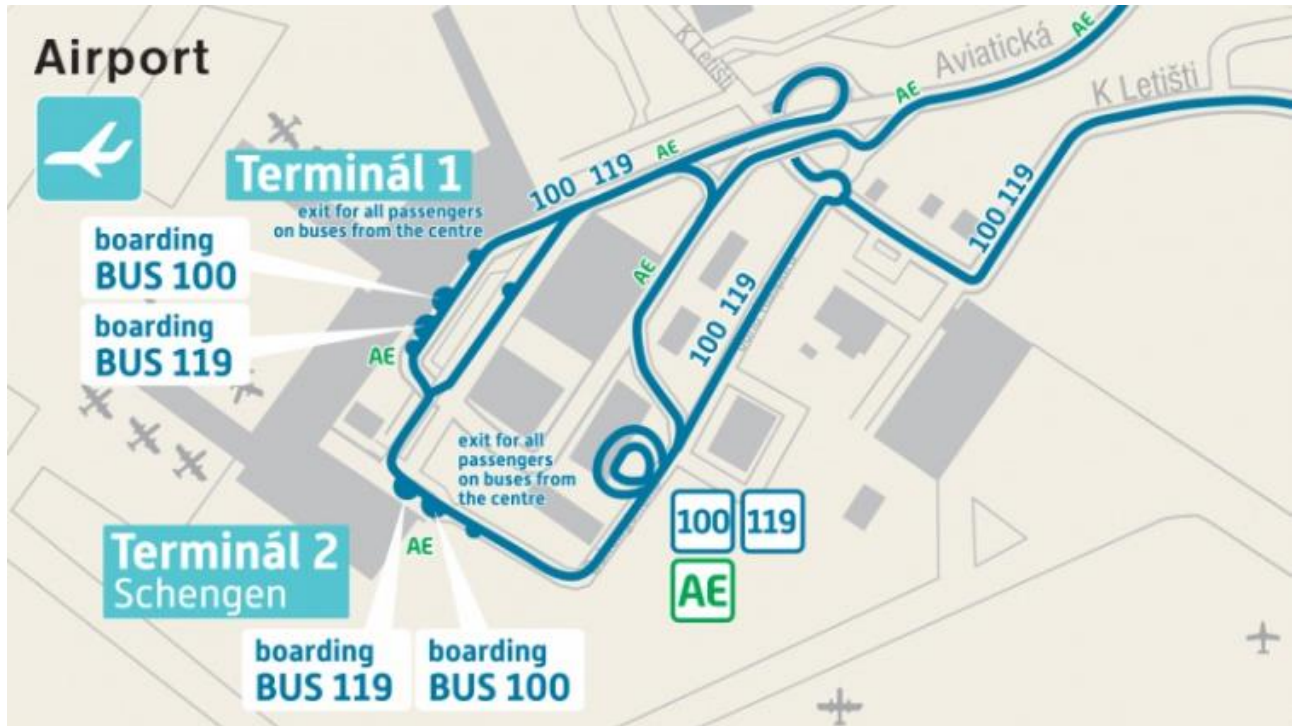
Accommodation: Accommodation for the participants for both nights is provided in the residential space of Villa Grébovka. Villa Grébovka is located close to the center of Prague in Havlíčkovy sady 58/2, 120 00 Praha.

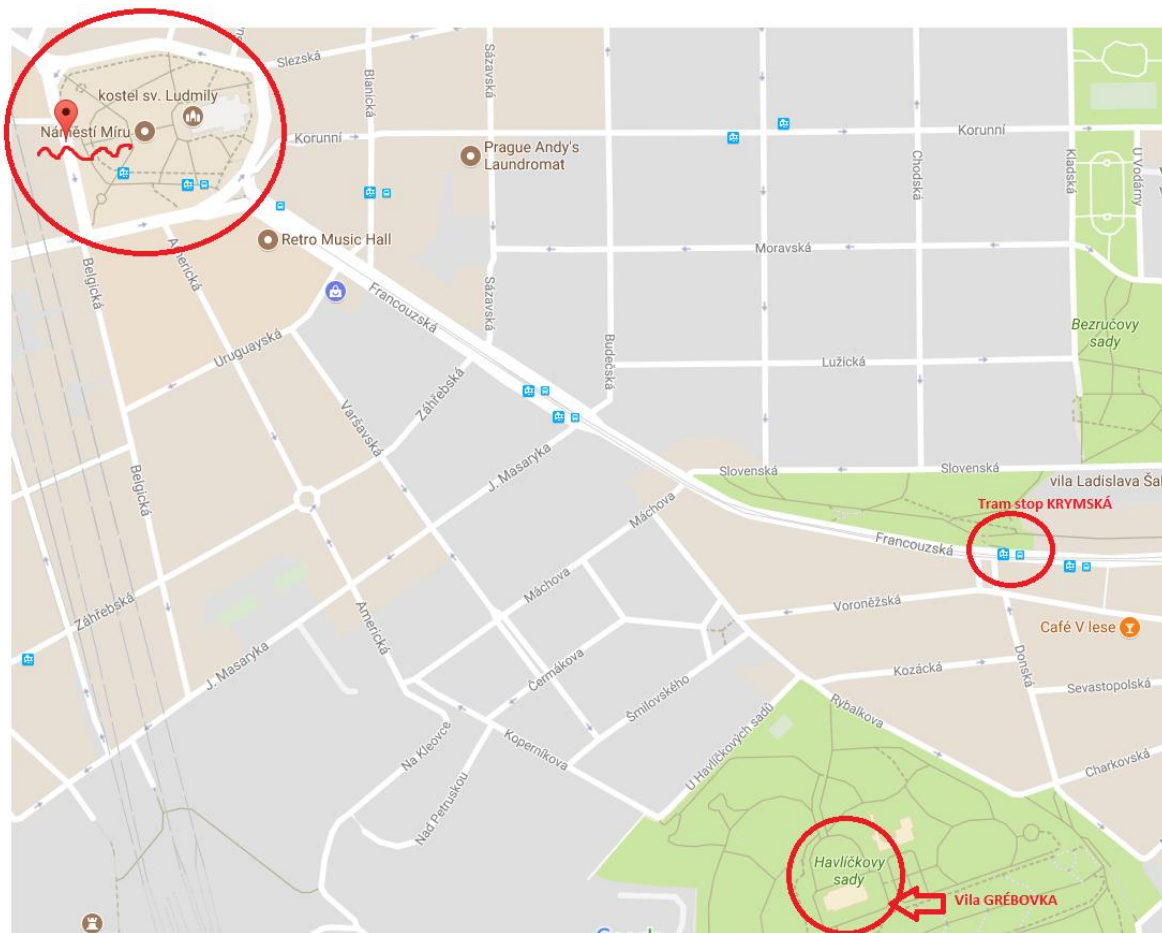
Local transport

From the airport to Villa Grébovka (cca 60 min.): The best way is to take **bus number 119** in front of the airport hall (you can buy a ticket in a ticket machine that accepts credit cards at the same place - remember to stamp your ticket) and get off at the last stop, **Nádraží Veleslavín**, where you can transfer to **green metro line A** and go all the way to the stop **Náměstí Míru**. From Náměstí Míru it is a 10-minute walk to Villa Grébovka, or it is also possible to take tram no. 7 or 13 or 22 from Náměstí Míru to **Krymská**. From Krymská, Villa Grébovka is within a walking distance.

From the main train station to Villa Grébovka (cca 20 min.): At the train station (hlavní nádraží) buy a ticket and stamp it, take **red metro line C** (which is inside the train hall) and get off at the stop **I.P. Pavlova**. Get out of metro and transfer to the **tram stop I.P. Pavlova** where you take tram no. 7 or 13 or 22 and go to the stop **Krymská**. From Krymská, Villa Grébovka is within a walking distance.
